PARISH COUNCIL NEWS - JUNE 2017

The next meeting of the parish council will take place at the village hall on Monday July 24th at 7.30pm. A Public Forum will take place at 7.15pm when residents can put questions to the council.

- The council decided in the meeting that they would place restrictions on the running of the public forum. Sometimes an emotive issue will arise and the forum becomes very lengthy making it difficult to fit the rest of the business on the agenda into a statutory meeting of manageable length. Therefore each resident wishing to speak at the forum will be limited to 3 minutes with only one spokesperson for any one issue.
- It was decided that it should be indicated on the parish council section of our website what areas of village affairs our councillors are connected with. This will make it easier for residents to contact a councillor who is fully informed about the issue they wish to discuss.
- A resident attended the forum to explain his difficulty in crossing the new car park on the footpath when there were vans parked in adjacent parking spaces and he could not see round them. He suggested that a zebra crossing or raised paving for the footpath would increase safety by making drivers more aware of the possible presence of pedestrians. He also asked when the promised yellow lines would be painted on Mere Lane as part of the congestion relief measures.
- The mystery of the white posts on Waste Lane has been solved. The council has been contacted by a member of Waste Lane Residents Association which is active in keeping the lane tidy and safe and have introduced them to stop inappropriate parking. A meeting has been arranged so that the WLRA and the council can work together to maintain Waste Lane effectively.
- Delamere Manor has been granted planning permission for their activities. There are restrictions and this is temporary for 12 months after which time it will be reviewed.
- CWAC will be sending a survey out randomly to 3,500 residents. It will deal with maintenance issues. Borough Councillor Harry Tonge asked that those receiving it would complete the survey as they are in effect our representatives and this is a chance to highlight any problems we have.
- A plan has been submitted with a view to turning Beechfield (the former i Map premises) into a Rehabilitation Centre, which will create an estimated 34 jobs. The property is a Grade 1 listed building and also in the green belt. A meeting will be arranged with CWAC and the parish council to discuss this.
- The council recorded their thanks to Cllr Lee Jones and his team for putting on another highly successful village gala.

MERE LANE PARKING UPDATE

The Mere Lane car park extension is now nearing completion. Cheshire Highways have a task list they are working through in order to finish the project. This includes:

- ♦ Erecting permanent barriers above the retaining wall, re-seeding the grass verges, where necessary and replacing the cherry tree.
- ♦ Creating a new disabled parking space in the bay in front of Mere Lane shops
- ♦ Implementing the Traffic Regulation Order in relation to double yellow lines and parking time restrictions, which was agreed following consultation earlier this year.


