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OUR NEW VILLAGE WEBSITE IS LAUNCHED

In response to requests for better communication about village life arising from the Cuddington and Sandiway Village Plan survey carried out last year, the Facilities and Communities Working Group are launching a new village website from the 1st October 2016. Support was provided by the Parish Council who approved the plan earlier in the year and made available funding to secure a new domain name. The new website combines the information previously available on the www.cuddingtonandsandiway.co.uk site with new content and features designed for greater interactivity and day to day usefulness.

The new site is available at www.candsonline.org and includes directories of local businesses, clubs and activities and local services, an online forum for residents to discuss and comment on matters of local interest and a calendar of village events. Feedback and ideas for improvement are welcomed from residents of Cuddington and Sandiway. "The website development was initiated and led by Russell Smith, Chair of the Facilities and Communities (F&C) working group of the Village Plan Implementation team of volunteers. It is hoped that the new website will provide all residents with better information and improved awareness of events, services and support available in the village, and an opportunity to discuss, online, matters affecting the village."

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS - SEPTEMBER 2016

Howard Hampson was invited to attend this month's meeting as the parish council wished to mark his retirement as village webmaster. Howard has been fulfilling this role for 16 years and the chairman, Ken Nixon, thanked him on behalf of the council and the residents of the village for his work during that time, and presented him with a gift. Howard looked back to how the website came into being. It seems he had been in the White Barn chatting to Roger King, then editor of the Round Tower newsletter and Howard said, "why don't we have a website?" So they had a meeting and the idea blossomed into a website simply for the purpose of getting the newsletter on-line. Over the years of course, Howard developed it into a website the village could be proud of with additional interesting information and excellent photographs of our village.

Matters discussed in the Public Forum included neighbourliness, as defined by such things as having bonfires on pleasant summer days when people want to be out in their gardens and throwing bags of dog waste into hedgerows - which was clearly not the purpose of introducing these bags. Do we need a 'Good Neighbour scheme'? The matter will be referred to the relevant Working Group of the Village Plan Implementation Group.

The Neighbourhood Plan chairman, John Kerrigan, updated the council on the progress of this important document. Since the Localisation Act was passed communities have had more powers to make their own decisions and a Neighbourhood Plan is a legal document setting out how residents would like their community to develop. However each community has still been given a quota of new houses they have to meet by 2030. John said that as things stand at present we could actually be 17 over this quota. The group have been working on a Housing Needs Survey which all residents should have received and the results and next steps will be rolled out in roadshows throughout the month (see p1). There is a lengthy formal process to go through before the plan can become a legal document and it will take more than a year to complete.

- Parking on Mere Lane. A Plan has been drawn up for introducing double yellow lines on junctions and opposite the parking spaces in front of the shops. A copy of the plan will be put up in the library and letters will be sent to all residents on Mere Lane and Fir Lane.
- There have been complaints about the bus service with correspondents pointing out that Weaverham has a 15 minute service so why can't we. This will be referred to the Village Plan Implementation Group.
- A planning application for a house on a tennis court at a property on Smithy Lane has been refused by CWAC
- An application to build a dwelling on land adjacent to 28 Blake Lane has also been refused.
- To end on a cheerful note the council has decided to buy new lights for the Christmas Tree which they provide for the village each year and which is displayed in the grounds of St John's Church.

DOES THIS VILLAGE NEED A YOUTH CLUB?

Currently our Youth Club is open on Thursday evenings from 6pm – 7.30pm in term time for young people ages 10-16 years. It is run by volunteers and if more could be found then the club could open on an additional night if there is a demand but over the past year numbers attending have declined. Do we actually need a youth club? The club has two pool tables, table tennis, wii games and music (including drums). Also a boxing coach comes in once a month. There are also trips - the last one was to Manley Mere during the summer holidays. Leaders try to cater for the young people's interests.
