

Cuddington Parish Council

Minutes of the statutory meeting of the Council for the Parish of Cuddington
held on Monday 15th March 2021, at 7.15pm via Zoom.

PRESENT: – Cllr Chrimes (Chairman), Cllr Brooks, Cllr Crist, Cllr Hill, Cllr Kerrigan, Cllr Latham, Cllr Maddock, Cllr Phillips, and Cllr Ruchat.

Also present, was Clerk to the Council - Julie Chrimes, CWaC's Edwards, Fifield, and Williams and one member of the public.

The meeting commenced at 7.15pm.

70. **Apologies:** Cllr Vincent.
71. **Declaration of Interest and submission of register of interests.** There were none.
72. **Public airtime.** A member of the public raised concerns about the A556 Chester Road, the length of road he believes should be reduced to 30mph is from Dalefords Lane traffic lights to the entrance to Blakemere Village. The resident advised the meeting that the vibration is worse than ever and although speed is an issue the problem is mainly down to an extremely poor road surface.
