#### A LIFE WORTH CELEBRATING

## All friends of Dr Peter Chivers are invited to attend a Celebration of his Life on April 9<sup>th</sup> between 2pm and 4pm at the village hall.

Dr Chivers died on February 19<sup>th</sup> following surgery needed after a fall. He was 94 and will be remembered in this village for his tireless work in the community. Peter came to Cuddington in 1954 for his job at ICI. He was a member of the parish council for 32 years and it was his idea to start this newsletter in March 1995 which he edited for the first 4 years.

He believed that young people should be helped to make their way in life and raised money for many charities for disadvantaged young people. He and his wife, Jean, set up the village youth club, the 69ers, and Peter always continued to support it.

Peter was a firm advocate of the health benefits of physical fitness. He began long distance running in his 60s and ran his first marathon in Liverpool in 1987 after which he ran at least one marathon a year until 2000. His most remarkable running feat was a relay race from Land's End to John O'Groats which involved running a half marathon distance every day for 10 days. A few years later in his 70s he repeated it in reverse. He used these, and any other opportunity he could, to raise money for charity and in



1997 he was awarded an MBE for his charitable work. When the Queen heard about his running exploits she said he must be mad. When his sight began to fail through macular degeneration he set up a local support group. Until a few weeks before his death he was exercising for an hour a day on a variety of gym machines in his bedroom. Many of us will remember seeing him around the village running or riding his tandem.

#### **PARISH COUNCIL NEWS - MARCH 2017**

The next meeting of the parish council will take place at the village hall on Monday April 24th at 7.30pm. - A number of residents attended the public forum to comment on a planning application for a five bedroomed house off Roslyn Lane. It would be on a very narrow unmade track with difficult access. The house would also back onto properties on Cartledge Close where it would be higher than existing houses and would overlook their rooms. In the meeting the council recommended refusal on the grounds of visual amenity, poor access and not in keeping with the surroundings. It was also pointed out that the Neighbourhood Plan housing needs survey had indicated that the village did not need any more houses of this size.
- The council considered whether it should grit the village car park on Weaverham Road and decided to • adopt the same policy used throughout Cheshire West and Chester which is to not grit car parks.
- There have been comments from residents on the lack of a visible presence from our PCSO. As a result • the monthly police surgeries at the library will start again.
- There was, however, praise for the operation at the White Barn traffic lights. The police have said that 'numerous drivers were issued with tickets for contravening a red light and one for using a mobile phone whilst driving', Councillors would like this to be done more often.
- It seems there are 2 lists for those wanting allotments. All those on the parish councils list have been contacted but there may be some who are on Taylor Wimpey's list and who are not known to the council. Taylor Wimpey have been given a list of their legal obligations as agreed before building commenced. There are 12 people who have volunteered for the self governing process and the next step is to set up conditions for managing the allotments.

#### MERE LANE PARKING UPDATE

Residents will be pleased to note that we have now started work on the Mere Lane car park. Works commenced on 13th March and should be completed by the end of April.

The excavation works have now been completed and new drainage has been installed. Due to a potential footway collapse, a short section of the existing footway has been closed off, for health & safety reasons. We thank residents and businesses for their continued patience during the construction works, but hope that the short term disruption will result in long term parking improvements for the residents and businesses in the village.
