PARISH COUNCIL NEWS - JULY 2017

The next meeting of the parish council will take place at the village hall on Monday September 18th at 7.15pm. There is no meeting in August. A Public Forum will take place during the meeting when residents can put questions to the council. This will be very soon into the meeting and residents should still aim to arrive at 7.15.

- During the meeting the Council resolved to amend current standing orders to allow Council meetings to commence at 7.15pm. New recommendations are that the public open forum, where residents are invited to discuss any affairs affecting the parish, should be within the statutory meeting. Therefore the forum will now take place at agenda item 3 after Disclosure of Councillor's interest in items on the agenda. Public open forum will last no longer than 15 minutes.
- Before the meeting there was a presentation by How Planning, on behalf of The Bridge, about a planning application regarding the property on the A49 where iMap formerly ran an autism school. The plan involves demolishing all existing buildings except the gatehouse and building a state of the art rehabilitation centre for those with addiction problems and sufferers of stress associated conditions.

The existing house on the site is believed by many to be a grade 1 listed building but in fact it is not a statutory listed building. A councillor who is familiar with the recent history of the site pointed out that the house is in a very poor state and has stood empty for 4 years, attracting no interest in purchase until now.

Questions were asked about the clients it will attract. These will be private, paying clients who will be resident for between 4 and 21 weeks and will not be suffering from psychological disorders or be threatening in any way.

Traffic movements on and off the site are anticipated be less than when iMap ran their school but it is expected that it will create a large number of jobs, probably in excess of 30.

Councillors also noted that it is a brownfield site and concluded that the centre, to be called Beechfields, would have to provide an attractive, well maintained site to attract private clients. They felt that it would be a better use for the land than another housing estate which could otherwise be how it ended up. They raised no objections and stated their support for the project.

- There has been a lot of disquiet among residents because the Saturday morning police surgery no longer takes place and residents seldom see a police presence in the village. After consultation with the police it became clear why this is so. In our area there are 19 posts for Police Community Support Officers. Only 6 of these are filled. Our designated PCSO has had an operation and is on sick leave. There are 2 Police Officers delegated to our village but they have a wider area to cover and so most of their time is taken up with attending actual incidents. Therefore it seems unlikely that we will see routine visits. The council will monitor the response to any reported incidents in the village and be ready to intervene if the response is not felt to be appropriate or adequate.
- An incident recently took place on the section of the A49 between Eden Grange and the Weaverham roundabout. It involved a child and this caused grave concern as this section of road has been designated by CWAC as a safe walking route from the village to Weaverham High School. Our Borough Councillor, Harry Tonge was asked whether, in view of this, CWAC would be reconsidering their decision. He will report back on this.
- At the last meeting a resident asked for the path leading to Sandown Crescent across the new Mere Lane car park to be highlighted in some way to make drivers more aware of it for increased safety. CWAC has declined to do this saying it is not done elsewhere and would be setting a precedent.
