## THE STORY OF OUR BOWLING CLUB

Shortly before George Wilbraham left Delamere House around 1930 the Wilbraham family's long serving cook and house keeper a Mrs McClewley retired. She was offered a gift of a bungalow for life. A bungalow then known as "The Sheilings" now known as "Bowling Green Cottage" was built for her on land owned by the Wilbraham family on Norley Road.

The building of this bungalow left an odd piece of adjacent land too large for the old and now widowed house keeper to use as a garden. As a result this land was leased to the village through Cuddington Parish Council. It was stipulated that this land was to be used as an amenity for the common good. It was decided that a village bowling green would be a suitable use and in line with the spirit of the Wilbraham family's gift to the village.

On hearing of this outcome George Wilbraham was in full agreement and donated a trophy "The Wilbraham Cup" to the club which is competed for every year by the members to this day.

This year's competition for the Wilbraham Cup was held on June 10<sup>th</sup> and the winner was Sally McConnell of Delamere Park who became only the second lady in the long history of the competition to win the trophy.

Hazel Watts, the Ladies Captain, said that it is wonderful that a lady had won the trophy and an inspiration to the lady members of the club.

#### There will not be a meeting in August

Cllr Gillian Edwards is keen to start an 'Adopt a Street' scheme in the village. The scheme encourages residents to take pride in their own street and join together to help in its upkeep. She also has a volunteer to look after the planters outside Cuddington shops and hopes to find one for Sandiway. Cuddington Wildlife Group have exciting plans for wild flowers in the village. A meeting will take place soon for all those interested in becoming involved.

The council recorded their thanks to residents who voluntarily carried out a wonderful job of replanting at Mere Lane.

Following a complaint about speeding and potholes from a resident living on the A556 there has been a speed assessment carried out and data results are awaited. Some pot hole patching has already taken place.

There has been vandalism at Boundary Lane Green play area which will to cost £1,540 to repair.

The 48A Stagecoach bus service which goes through Cuddington to Delamere Park and Frodsham will change to Thursdays instead of Wednesdays to coincide with market day in Frodsham. The bus stops on Norley Road opposite the White Barn car park.

Concern was raised about overweight vehicles using Norley Road. It was felt that action is needed on this long running issue, starting with more signage.

Shell garage should have had a charging point for electric vehicles when it was rebuilt. This has not happened and councillors are not satisfied with this.

Councillors considered an application to demolish run down farm buildings and build one dwelling on a site on Cuddington Lane. They had no objections so long as our Neighbourhood Plan policies were adhered to.
