There will not be a meeting in August. The next meeting of the parish council will take place on Monday September 16th in the meeting room of the village hall, commencing at 7.15 pm. Any changes to the arrangements will be posted on the parish council noticeboards which are at the playing field car park and by the post box on Mere Lane.

- Representatives from Delamere clinic attended the meeting to ask for the council's support for an extension they are planning. The clinic is situated on the A49 opposite Forest Close and has been open for 4 years. Guests stay for 4 weeks and they provide therapeutic and wholistic treatments. There are 23 rooms and they now have a waiting list and are wanting to add 10 more rooms in an extension linked to the existing building plus 1-1 therapy rooms and a Paddle Ball court with changing room. Delamere employs 45 members of staff, most of whom are local. There have been no objections to the plans from neighbours. Councillors had no objections and were happy to support the application.
- The council has arranged for jet washing on Boundary Lane Green play area because there is moss growing on paved areas which can therefore become be slippery when wet and cause falls.
- The council is going to have bunds constructed on the village car park on Weaverham Road. The purpose of this is to prevent unauthorized vehicles from being able to gain access to the playing field. This is the recommended way of dealing with this problem rather than gates with padlocks which can easily be removed.

A connecting replacement bus will leave Altrincham at 2250 and call at all stations (Greenbank 2354, Cuddington 0002). Sundays 4 and 25 August: All trains are replaced by buses between Chester and Stockport, stopping outside Norley Road shops. To Chester, they depart at 10.08 and every 2 hours until 22.08. On 4 August, they depart to Stockport at 08.55, 10.50 and every 2 hours until 20.50, on 25 August, they depart to Stockport at 08.55, and every 2 hours until 20.55.

Monday 26 August: During the day trains will run only between Chester and Altrincham, with connecting buses to and from Stockport. To Chester, trains depart Cuddington at 09.18 and every 2 hours until 21.18, There are then replacement buses at 00.02 (22.27 from Stockport) and 01.08 (23.13 from Manchester). To Altrincham, trains depart at 07.18 and every 2 hours until 21.18. There is then a replacement bus at 23.42 22.52 Chester to Manchester).

Tuesday 27 to Thursday 29 August: : The 2252 Chester to Manchester (normally due Cuddington 2314) will be a bus calling at Cuddington at 2342.
