PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The next meeting of the parish council will take place on Monday December 6th in the meeting room of the village hall commencing at 7.15 pm. The first meeting of 2022 will take place on Monday January 17th.

- Concerns have been raised in relation to speeding tractors on School Lane and Norley Road. PCSO Gillet has submitted a funding application for road safety initiative equipment for Weaver Cuddington Ward.
- Following several complaints to Cheshire Police and the Parish Council, two vehicles in Ash Road close to Golden Nook Road junction have been issued with fixed penalty notices under rule 243 of the highway code for parking opposite or within 10 metres of a junction. The Parish Council will liaise with highways for the need for double yellow lines here or alternatively one single white line with signs to say 'no waiting'. This will allow for vehicles to pass safely without altering their journey course.
- Residents contacted the Parish Council expressing their gratitude for the clearance of the footpath leading from Norley Road playing fields to Greenfield Way. The footpath had become extremely overgrown with bramble, nettles, weeds, and leaves.
- The parish council have applied to Cheshire west and Chester Council for the Sandiway Surgery building to be listed as a community asset. This can be done because its main use has recently been to further the social wellbeing or social interests of the local community and it could do so in the future.

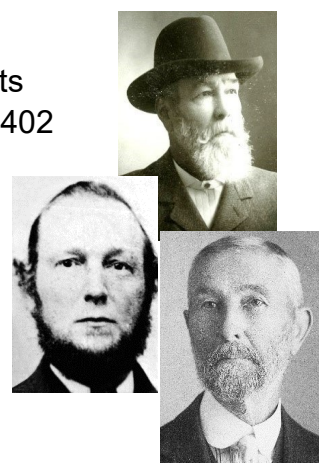
