#### From the Parish Council - In this special edition of the Round Tower, we thought it would be a good opportunity to tell you about recent developments in the work of the Parish Council in addition to the Resilience Planning...

It seems a long time ago since the Village Plan was written – high on the list of requests by residents was a zebra crossing, to help children feel safer when crossing Norley Road to get to the Playing Fields. The Parish Council are delighted to tell you that the zebra crossing has been given the green light by Cheshire West and Chester Council and we are hoping that it will be installed within the next few months.

Residents have expressed their concerns about speeding drivers. Some roads are more prone to drivers disregarding the speed limits and the PCSO has been working with residents to monitor the situation. It is hoped that we can encourage drivers to adhere to the speed limits and drive responsibly in and around Cuddington, Sandiway and Delamere Park. With this aim in mind, the Parish Council are in the process of purchasing movable electronic speed activated devices to locate in several places around the Parish. They are similar to the ones you may have seen in Acton Bridge, Weaverham and Hartford.

CEMEX, the company who own the sand quarry, have generously offered to donate some money to the Parish Council towards the cost of installing CCTV at Sandiway Library. This project is a joint enterprise with CWAC and Cuddington Parish Council, an intervention deemed necessary due to disappointingly poor behaviour in and around the Library.

In July the Parish Council sold the land off the A49 along the footpath in between the wealth management company and the butcher, known as Flea Moss Pit. The land has been sold to a local builder who plans to build two bungalows which will be in keeping with the adjacent properties on Cheryl Court.

Following the restrictions of Covid19 members of the Parish Council have enjoyed being able to meet in person back in the routine of monthly meetings. This has been a busy year, one of the highlights being the celebration of the late Queen's Jubilee with a Picnic in the Park on the evening of Gala Day followed by Afternoon Tea on the following afternoon.

**Warning.** In the new timetable, trains will arrive from both directions at the same time. Let them depart before crossing the line.

Some 4-coach trains have doors on an end coach locked because they are too long for some platforms There is a Monday to Friday 1708 Stockport to Chester calling at nearly all stations but beware, it does not call at Cuddington or Delamere.

**Sunday 11 December:** New timetable commences. Most Monday to Saturday times will be earlier. Trains to Manchester depart Cuddington at 0618, 0711, 0818 and hourly until 2218, 2314. To Chester, they go at 0716 and hourly until 2316, 0020 (a few are a minute or two later) There are also Monday to Friday extras: 06:30 and 0712 Chester - Cuddington 0652 and 0741 - Stockport, and Stockport 1754 - Cuddington 1851 - Chester. Sunday trains are mostly unaltered: to Manchester at 0925, 1117, 1320, 1524, 1724, 1927 and 2120; to Chester at 1015, 1209, 1414, 1614, 1814, 2014 and 2208.

Saturdays 24 and 31 December The last trains will be a lot earlier than in previous years-

1956 Chester to Manchester Piccadilly, due Cuddington 2018.

1910 Manchester Piccadilly to Chester, due Cuddington 2016.

Tuesday 27 to Mid January: Normal service, except for early finish on 31 December Sunday 25 December and Monday 26 December No trains



Cuddington Parish Community Emergency Plan

Cuddington Parish Council, in common with other parishes within Chester West and Chester has started to prepare a Resilience Plan for the village. A Resilience Planning Group has been formed, supported by CWAC who have provided guidance for resilience planning, plus a contact within the authority whose job is to coordinate all the community resilience plans. Resilience Plans are intended to be an organized way of using local people and resources to help the emergency services to support people as needed.

Recent examples of emergencies have shown that communities can be affected by power outages and bad weather for long periods when emergency services are at full stretch. In our own area, flooding in Acton Bridge created major problems for residents there when the emergency services were fully utilised in the centre of Northwich and unable to help elsewhere. The purpose of the Resilience Plan is to identify those resources that exist in our village that could be brought into use in a timely and coordinated manner should an emergency or catastrophic situation occur. Resources can be people, organisations, buildings, equipment, transport, or specialised knowledge. Identifying these resources will ensure that what we have will be used in the most effective way to assist villagers.

The process of telling our community about the Resilience Plan began in October and we are grateful to those people who subsequently offered their services and places of shelter. We are keen to find out the extent of what resources we have in the village and how they could be brought into use if necessary. For example: Do we have any First Aiders? Has someone got a tractor to drag trees away? Which of the village halls can we bring into use to provide emergency shelter? The Parish Council hopes you will get on board and assist us in the process of identifying skills and resources. We will also be appealing directly to villagers who have specialist knowledge and skills to get involved. We know that many organisations and businesses already help the most vulnerable in the village, the recent COVID lockdowns demonstrated that, and your experience and knowledge could be vital in the event that the Resilience Plan is put into action.

There is some way to go, but having prepared the plan we will then be in a position to work quickly and efficiently with CWAC, First Responder Services and utility companies should the village be in a difficult situation and need to cope on its own for a period of time. **Importantly, it will help to ensure that the most vulnerable can be identified and supported appropriately.** 

In the case of an emergency the first thing to do is to <u>dial 999</u> and seek help from the emergency services. If the situation has or is likely to have a detrimental impact on our community the Clerk to the Parish Council will be contacted by the Community Resilience Network and the Resilience Plan will be put into action. At this point a chain of communication will begin and the people contacted will act according to the role allocated in the Resilience Plan.

#### Would you be willing to volunteer your services?

Your contribution could be key in helping people cope with the immediate crisis and the aftermath. If you have knowledge and skills or resources that could be useful in an emergency situation then please contact the Community Resilience Planning Group (contact details are below).


#### Would you be willing to act as a point of contact for your street?

If disaster does strike we will urgently need people with a wide range of skills

- Are you a plumber that can isolate a burst pipe to keep someone in their home?
- Have you got a tractor or 4x4 to drag a tree from blocking a road.?
- . Can your shop provide drinking water urgently?
- Can you board up a broken window?
- Are you a qualified First Aider or have medical training?

## If so, and you would be willing to help, please register as a Resilience Plan Partner

We are not asking that you make full repairs- all that can wait until the crisis is over and normality returns, insurance companies get involved, highways clear roads and life returns to normal, but **it's a 'crack on' and we'll sort it later situation** 

You would only be contacted by a member of the Resilience Team who would clearly identify themselves and show their identification., and not just by a member of the public.

In the event of a widescale emergency, that immediate help to make homes safe and secure would ensure that villagers can stay warm and comfortable in their own homes.

We know that many villagers can manage and will be self-sufficient but we know we do have vulnerable people in the village who will need this kind of help.

#### ST JOHN'S CHURCH SANDIWAY 1902 - 2022 ITS HISTORY AND A MYRIAD OF MEMORIES

When John Douglas designed his church at the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century, he probably didn't realize that he was not only creating a perfect place for the faithful to worship but he was also producing a wonderful setting for the making of a



*Myriad of Memories*. Since St John's became a Parish Church for Sandiway in 1935, it has had seven vicars; nine lay readers; ten churchwardens; six full time musical directors; and a number of Sunday School, Youth and Mother's Union Leaders. There have been weddings, baptisms and funerals a plenty and annual, special and historical events. Well over one hundred people have helped to put this book together. Many have sent their memories in writing, thirty have been interviewed in their own homes. Others have searched boxes in their their lofts and attics to find old photographs and ephemera. Within, there are nearly 200 pages of quality paper packed with 366 colour and black and white photographs. All the memories are special and some are sheer moments of magic.
