HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN WALKING IN KENNEL WOOD?

Following the sale of Kennel Wood in small plots there have been problems identifying official footpaths within the wood and also a number of unofficial footpaths have been created over the years as the public has been accustomed to wandering freely in the wood.

The parish council have been working with CWAC and with the new landowners to try and create a network of footpaths which is acceptable to walkers and landowners. This process is nearing completion but it has been suggested that the route through the wood from the car park at Blakemere to Kennel Lane is registered as a footpath. To assist with this the parish council needs to gather the names of people who have been walking this route for at least 20 years. PARISH COUNCIL NEWS - JANUARY 2017

The next meeting of the parish council will take place at the village hall on Monday February 20th at 7.30pm. A Public Forum will take pace at 7.15pm when residents can put questions to the council.

A resident attended the public forum with a suggestion that the stones from the Round Tower could be used to create planters which could be placed around the village. It was pointed out that some people would like to see it used for a War Memorial but the feeling was that there was more than enough stone for both these projects. The immediate problem is to find storage for the stone as CWAC want to relinquish responsibility for it. A letter will be sent informing them that we definitely want the stone. The next problem will be to find someone to move the projects forward.

It was brought to the attention of the council that there is a pile of wood chippings in the corner of the Weaverham Road car park and this is attracting fly tipping with people seeing it is some sort of rubbish tip. In fact this pile is left by prior arrangement with the council by several tree surgeons and is used in the maintenance of public areas in the village for mulch and ground cover to keep down weeds. The arrangement is of mutual benefit and the dumping of rubbish is hindering the work. A more discreet site will be found to discourage dumping and people are asked not to use it for illegal fly tipping.

CWAC councillor Harry Tonge informed us that some residents will receive a questionnaire. This will ask you to give your views on the performance of your parish council. It is being sent to a random sample of households and there is no need to be concerned if you get one and others do not, or indeed if you do not get one when others do.

A planning application has been made to cut down some trees in the grounds of Redwalls. This has been done at the recommendation of tree surgeons because of the poor condition of the trees. The council had no objections.

An appeal has been made for a decision on an application for access between School Lane and St John's Way. CWAC has not yet completed this and the Secretary of State has now recommended that this should be done.

A complaint has been made about people parking on the grass verges on Mere Lane. Earth which is disturbed is spreading onto the pavement and making it slippery during wet weather thus causing a hazard to pedestrians. Although the Village Plan Implementation Group is aware of the problem the group's chairman said that they expected individuals to sort this out between themselves.

The public consultation phase of the Neighbourhood Plan has been completed and a draft is being prepared which will be studied by the parish council.

HOMEWATCH

Cheshire Police have issued a warning after a spate of burglaries across the county. They say that out of 7 burglaries reported 5 of the properties were unlocked and they urge the public to review their security arrangements and recommend the following;



• making sure you lock doors, including outbuildings, even when you are at home.

- keeping windows locked
- not leaving valuable items or keys visible from outside
- · leaving lights and radios on a timer setting when you are out

They also warn us that on March 1st a change in Traffic Law will come into effect. This concerns the use of mobile phones and also other hand held devices. It is, and has been since December 2003, illegal to use a hand held device whilst driving or whilst stationary with the engine on. The penalty for contravening the law will be \pounds 200 and 6 penalty points. New drivers will lose their licence and have to retake their test. **Contact the police on 101. It was formerly very popular with attendance of about 25-30 young people a few nights a week. Now there are only a few turning up which does not allow the committee to apply for funding. At present the club receives funding from Cheshire West and Chester Council but this will end in April if there are not enough young people attending regularly.
