- Our PCSO, Michelle Gillett, attended the January meeting with some updates. Concern has been expressed by a number of people about the traffic lights by the White Barn. The number of vehicles crossing on a red light is very worrying and it was felt that the change-over time needs to be increased.
- The rules for performing speed checks has changed. Three people are needed now to use the equipment where previously it was two so Michelle is finding it hard to get enough volunteers to use them. If you can help please contact her see below.
- A resident of Mere Lane commented on the amount of speeding that takes place there.
- A request has been made for a dog waste bin on Delamere Park.
- A reminder was given to keep using the 'Report It' section on the CWAC website which allows people to report things such as potholes. Doing this could push them up the list for attention. You can also use the link on the village website to make reports.
- Gillian Edwards told the meeting about the wonderful response she had received after a comment on facebook highlighting the fact that many families could not afford Christmas presents for their children. Donations came pouring in as a result and she thanks all who responded.
- Gillian is also arranging for free lunches to be provided at the library again during school holidays
- The council are very grateful to the Police Commissioner, John Dwyer, for his donation to the provision of street lamps along the path through the playing field to Greenfield Way. The path has improved safety and security for all accessing the Youth Club as well as for walkers on the footpath. The cost of these was £6,800 and half was donated by the Commissioner.
- Defibrillators. In addition to the 3 council owned defibrillators in the village mentioned in a previous issue, there is also one at Cuddington station. Others are situated in places such as our primary schools but are not therefore accessible at all times. The British Heart Foundation website has a wealth of information about defibrillators including how to use them and where you can find them by using a post code.
