You will remember being asked for your views on proposals, made by Cheshire West and Chester Highways together with the Parish Council, for changes to the parking arrangements on Mere Lane and Fir Lane. These involve introducing double yellow lines on junctions and opposite the parking spaces in front of the shops. We have reviewed the feedback and the response to this will be available to view in Sandiway Library during January.

The Parish Council is planning to progress with the proposed new parking provisions for Mere Lane and Fir Lane when work takes place on the new additional car park.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS - DECEMBER 2016

The next meeting of the parish council will take place at the village hall on Monday January 16th at 7.30pm. A Public Forum will take pace at 7.15pm when residents can put questions to the council.

- Extension of Cuddington Primary School The Headteacher of Cuddington Primary School, Mrs Mills, attended the Public Forum accompanied by a Planner who is working on the extension of the school buildings. To accommodate the increased in the number of children in the village as a result of our new housing developments the school will take in 45 pupils in each year group from September 2017 rather than the present 30. This could later rise to 60 if needed. New classrooms will be necessary as the bigger intake works its way through the school. The proposed plans would reduce the area of playground and sports field and councillors were concerned about the loss of this valuable space. It was explained that the only alternative available was an extra storey and this was not desirable because of possible structural problems and visual impact. There would also be a need to increase onsite parking for staff by one and perhaps eventually 2 spaces. The issue that most concerned councillors was the increase in traffic at the beginning an end of the day, something which already causes many problems. Mrs Mills felt that mornings would not be a big problem and that solutions could be found for pick up time. One possibility is that finish times could be staggered and professional advice would be given on solutions to this problem. The council supports the plan.
- Can we find a temporary home for the remains of the Round Tower? Borough Councillor Harry Tonge reminded the council that the damaged stone which could not be used in the rebuild of the Round Tower is still being stored by CWAC and they would like it to be moved. After the rebuild there was a feeling that it should be put to some use in the village. One suggestion was a War Memorial, something which the village lacks but unfortunately a parish council is unable to build a war memorial although it can maintain an existing one. It was suggested at the meeting that the stone could be sold and the money used for a project for the village. In the meantime it will be necessary to find a storage place for it and the council are hoping to find someone with a suitable venue. Cllr Tonge estimated that the stone will fill a space the size of a double garage. If anyone has such a place possibly an unused garage or outbuilding the council would like to hear from them.
- **Maintenance work affecting the A49.** Work is due to commence on January 23rd on the swing bridge at Acton Bridge. It is estimated that it will last until June or July. During that time there will be single file traffic across the bridge controlled by traffic lights.
- **Licence granted.** Cheshire Falconry has been granted a licence for music and alcohol in order to put on events such as weddings. There are however, conditions which must be observed.

UPDATE ON THE WORK OF THE VILLAGE PLAN IMPLEMENTATION GROUP Facilities and Community

A new website has been set up to provide a comprehensive guide to village activities and amenities. Steps are being taken to improve broadband and mobile phone connectivity in area.

Work is taking place with Sandiway Doctors' Surgery to protect and improve the service in the village. **Traffic and Transport**

Traffic data is to be collected at 9 locations in village hopefully in January 2017. This will be used to inform decisions on how to alleviate problems highlighted in village plan surveys such as parking, grass verges, pavements, traffic speed and general safety.

The Group has submitted a recommendation to CWAC to resurface a number of areas of pavement which hopefully will be included in Highway's work programme for 2017/18.

Environment

Regular litter picking sessions have taken place. Anyone wishing to do their own litter pick may collect and return litter pickers, gloves and high visibility jackets from Sandiway Library. Litter bags are also available. A small working group has been formed to do planting in public areas.

One key action identified was to improve recycling rates within the village therefore the group are promoting the CWAC Food Waste Recycling Campaign to encourage more use of Brown Food Recycling Bin for food waste rather than black bins. Residents should have had an information booklet from CWAC
