PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The next meeting of the parish council will take place at the village hall on Monday January 15th at 7.15pm. A Public Forum will take place during the meeting when residents can put questions to the council. This will be very soon into the meeting and residents should arrive for 7.15pm.

- Harry Tonge, one of our CWAC borough councillors, highlighted 2 public consultations to which residents might like to contribute their thoughts. One is the Low Emission Strategy which is open for comment until January 12th. The other concerns the use of Public Assets and this is open until February 25th. See details of a drop in session on this one at the library (page 3).
- The decisions made as a result of the recent Review of Ward Boundaries will be announced on January 16th.
- Harry also informed the council that there is still money in the Members Budget which our borough councillors have available to help organisations in their areas. The Bowls Club have been able to acquire a new lawn mower through this scheme.
- The council has set the parish precept for 2018-19 and there will be no increase on last year.
- There is concern over the lack of progress regarding the allotments which Taylor Wimpey must provide for the village on a designated area of the Eden Grange site and communication with the company is proving difficult. Therefore the Working Party will be convened in January with the intention of calling an extraordinary meeting to tackle this lack of progress.
- A variation has been granted to increase opening hours at Define Wines but it is subject to some conditions.
- After difficulties on our roads during the recent bad weather councillor Chrimes contacted CWAC about gritting. She was told that the only roads in the village on the gritting route are Weaverham Road, Norley Road and School Lane. This leaves Ash Road untreated and bus drivers refused to go down it, considering it too dangerous. Passengers, including school children, therefore had to walk to other access points. After some persistence councillor Chrimes persuaded them to grit Mere Lane and Ash Road but it seems likely that the scenario will be repeated next time we have bad weather.

WOULD YOU ENJOY HELPING YOUNG CHILDREN TO BLOSSOM?

We have been contacted by an organisation called Passion for Learning. It is a charitable organization committed to enthusing children about reading and learning by making it fun, exciting and motivating. They are looking for volunteers to work 1:1 with primary school children (ages 4-11) in Winsford to bring them books that they want to read and games and activities that increase their skills and help them to grow in confidence. Above all, the work they do is full of imagination and fun to make children curious about their world and keen to find out more.

Passion for Learning works hard to ensure that volunteers enjoy an excellent experience providing full training, regular ongoing support and a wealth of social activities that ensure that the team feels like a very big family. The volunteers are a diverse group of men and women of all ages. Previous experience of working with children is not necessary. Enthusiasm, imagination, a good sense of humour and, most of all, a passion for learning is all that is required. Volunteers go in to see three children during the school day, typically twice a week spending about half an hour with each. Volunteers establish strong connections with the children so commitment and reliability are looked for.

A volunteer says, "It is so rewarding seeing the children begin to gain confidence in their reading or become enthusiastic about a subject they perhaps had no knowledge of before. It is only a short amount of time each week but it can make the most incredible difference to the children, many of whom come from homes where there is not a lot of time and attention for them individually."
