## Cuddington Neighbourhood Plan Undertaken by Cuddington Parish Council

The Neighbourhood Plan sets out a vision for the future of the Parish and describes planning policies which will be used to determine planning proposals for our Neighbourhood Area. The **Neighbourhood Area** covers the whole Parish of Cuddington, Delamere Park and Sandiway. You will remember being asked about these policies at the end of last year.

Once a Draft Neighbourhood Plan is written it must be tested via consultation before it can be submitted to Cheshire West and Chester Council. This is known as the **Pre Submission consultation**.

The Pre-Submission version of the Draft Neighbourhood Plan is now ready for its first stage of Formal Consultation. Statutory bodies such as the Environment Agency, Natural England, Network Rail and Highways Agency etc. must now be given a chance to comment on the Draft Plan. In addition, adjacent parish councils, and voluntary organisations in our Parish along with people who live, work or carry on business in the neighbourhood area will be given the same opportunity.

The consultation opens for comment on Saturday 10th June 2017 and the deadline for comments to be received by Cuddington Parish Council will be Friday 21st July 2017. Details of how to take part in the consultation will be given in the documents. These can be viewed on the Neighbourhood Plan pages of the village website.

The Neighbourhood Plan team will be at the Gala to show you the documents and to talk you through them, and to show you how to take part in the consultation. Watch out for our stall. See you there!!!

## **PARISH COUNCIL NEWS - INCLUDING ANNUAL ASSEMBLY - MAY 2017**

- The new chairman of the parish council is John Faulkner. His first duty was to thank Ken Nixon, the previous chairman, for all his hard work over many years of outstanding service on the parish council. The new vice chairman is Sheila Brooks.
- The Head teachers of both our primary schools gave a joint report at the Annual Assembly. Mrs Mills from Cuddington School said that the parking problem at the school had been eased considerably by opening a gate at the back of the school to allow entry from 2 points. The building work for new classrooms is expected to be finished on time. The school was rated as Good in a recent Ofsted report. Mr Priddy reported that Sandiway School is full with 215 pupils and that some junior classes were just over 30 which is considered acceptable in a junior class. They went on to speak of the value of collaboration between the two schools. Year 6 children are meeting to get to know one another before they transfer to Weaverham High School together. There is also a joint schools choir which will be performing at the village Gala. They stated that the schools share similar philosophies. When asked about the possible effects of budget cuts they both said that inevitably it would result in reduced staffing levels. However they are devising ways to reduce costs by such measures as sharing the cost of staff training by running joint sessions including staff from both schools.
- The report from the Playing Field Association mentioned minor incidents of vandalism to waste bins but, more worryingly, the police had to be called because of drug trafficking taking place behind the footballers' storage container. The poplars which had to be taken down for safety reasons have been replaced and another tree has to be removed. The youth club has now closed leaving an unused building on site and they now have to consider its future use. Groundwork Trust have been engaged for the project of refurbishing the playing field. Detailed information on this is given in the gala brochure which all residents should have received and Groundwork Trust will have a stand at the gala.
- A report from our representatives on the Cemetery Committee mentioned 2 problems, very different in nature. Unfortunately there has been vandalism at the cemetery which is obviously very distressing for those who have the graves of loved ones there. The committee will be installing solar powered infra red cameras to try and stop this. The second issue involved bad press for the committee when an article appeared about someone being asked to remove a memorial item that was not within the rules. The committee try to deal with these matters as tactfully as possible but it is necessary to exercise controls over what people can place around the graves for reasons of safety and maintenance.
- It seems that the money to pay for new speed limits on the A49, A556 and Cuddington Lane will have to come from Section 106 money belonging to the village. It will not however, affect current projects being undertaken using this money.
- The council is to investigate ownership of land at Ravensclough Waste where posts have been erected to prevent access. The Parish Council agreed to investigate and take any appropriate action".
- The concerns of the council over the siting of a zebra crossing on Norley Road have been listened to. CWAC is now willing to put the crossing further along the road past Tricket Lane to avoid the very busy area opposite Cuddington shops.
