Did you know that the village website has now been active for 18 months in its current form? The site is attracting 4,000 visits per month, a number that has been steadily rising this year.

The origin of the site came as part of implementation of the Village Plan survey and recommendations arising from it. A dedicated team of volunteers, supported by the Parish Council, developed a new website for our community and this culminated in launch of the site in November 2016. The volunteers involved currently are Russell Smith, Jim Wren, David Ruchat, John Faulkner and Heather Thompson.

The website team meets quarterly to discuss development of the site and recent changes include addition of a 'search' function, addition of Neighbourhood Plan documents and revision of the gallery of community images. It is important that the website is kept fresh and Russell, the webmaster, regularly adds news items and documents, updates the calendar of community events and integrates links requested by community clubs and other local organisations.

It is important that the team can respond to your needs for the website and cater for all sections of the community. As such we welcome any content such as news items and articles about matters of importance to our community – please just contact Russell at; webmaster@cuddingtonandsandiwayonline.org.

We would also welcome additional community minded volunteers to the website group, especially if we can grab a little time from those busy people with young families and from young people in the village. If you can spare just a few hours every month, please let us know.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The next meeting of the parish council will take place at the village hall on Monday June 18th at 7.15pm. A Public Forum will take place during the meeting when residents can put questions to the council. This will be very soon into the meeting and residents should arrive for 7.15pm.

- It was 'no change' for the council as the annual election of roles took place at this meeting. John Faulkner will continue in the chair with Sheila Brookes as vice chair. All subcommittees remain the same as councillors want to continue the projects they have been working on over the past year and feel the knowledge they have gained would be valuable in moving these projects forward.
- There will be extensive work carried out on the playing field in the near future. The football pitches are in poor condition and in great need of attention. This work is being carried out due to the village having money as a result of the new houses which have been built here, it is referred to as Section 106 money and in this case it has been designated for sports and leisure. For this work to be carried out a large area of the playing field will be fenced off for a lengthy period which will include 'settling time'. This period is important for the work to be effective in creating pitches which are safe and suitable for playing football so the council ask for patience and forbearance while the process is completed.
- There have been complaints about uncut grass verges and litter. The council has been told that the verges are not cut because of cars being parked on the verges and obstructing the mowers. The council will discuss solutions with Streetscene.
- There will be a meeting for all those on the allotment waiting list on Tuesday June 12th at Oaklands at 7.30pm. The waiting list is still open and anyone interested should contact John Faulkner on 01606 882780 or johnfaulkner11@sky.com
- The meeting was informed that the footpath leading from the far end of Waste Lane up the ramp to the Whitegate Way is 'a mess' so walkers might like to avoid this section of footpath and choose alternative.
- An appeal relating to a planning application for a dwelling adjacent to Emery Down on Waste Lane has been dismissed. It was considered to be inappropriate development in the Green Belt, would lead to a significant loss of openness and would conflict with one of the purposes of including land in the Green Belt.

PART TIME CHILDREN AND FAMILY WORKER NEEDED St John's Sandiway is looking for a part time Children and Family (CAF) Worker to help grow its work with families. St John's is an active church, that already has a strong offering for young people: a Junior Church, Messy Church, a Junior Choir, an improvised music group called JIMS, and a Youth Group. The church benefits from a dedicated team of volunteers and has recently benefited from 3 years of a dedicated CAF worker. The church now has funding for a further year, at 10 hours a week – this would be a fixed term contract in the first instance, though it is hoped that there would be the opportunity to renew after the first year. The new CAF worker would deliver sessions with children, liaise with existing volunteers and seek to identify and develop new opportunities. In reality, no money has ever been sent to the seller; the bogus buyer has spoofed an email and purported to be an online payment company. All contact is then severed with the seller.
