BIG ART PROJECT FOR OUR YOUTH CLUB

Putting Our Young People On The Map

After a successful relaunch three years ago and support from a local "Space Hive" campaign Cuddington And Sandiway Youth Club has been providing fun and inspiring activities for local young people and volunteering opportunities for adults. The club is now set to grow its artistic offering in club and beyond.

The club has been successful in getting a grant from Cheshire West Voluntary Action, Cuddington and Sandiway Parish Council and Northwich Rotary to start a new mosaic project. The project called "Putting Us On The Map" will start off with a challenge, inviting young people from the club and local schools to send in a photo of their favourite village places. The photos will be simplified into drawings and will form the backbone of the mosaic which will take shape in collaboration with the group's local mosaic artist. After many hands making light work the finished mosaic will find its forever home as a gift to Cuddington station in 2025.

Our PCSO, Michelle Gillett attended the Annual Assembly and introduced Nicola Devey who many of us will remember when she worked in the village previously and who will be returning to us.

Michelle reported that the person who vandalized the public toilets on the playing field had been identified thanks to CCTV. Hopefully this will discourage any further antisocial behaviour now that people realize that they can be seen.

Virgin Media have once again upset residents because of the work to bring fibre optic broadband to us. A resident of Windsor Close was concerned when he saw workmen remove a lamp post and then fill in the hole. They said they were not replacing it when work was finished, which is potentially hazardous to pedestrians in the dark and could cause dangerous electrical faults.

We were encouraged to report the state of the hedge on the A49 which is overhanging the foot path children use to get to school. The message is that the more reports CWAC receive the higher up the list an issue will go so we should all help by using 'Report It' online or by smart phone app to report any issue.

Concern was expressed about misuse of the village car park on Weaverham Road with drivers going the wrong way and going too fast while there are children around for football.

Sunday 2 June. New timetable starts. No change to times at Cuddington. A few other times are changed by a minute or two.

Monday 3 to Thursday 6 June: The 2252 Chester to Manchester (normally due Cuddington 2314) will be a bus calling at Cuddington at 2342.

Tuesday 4 to Thursday 6 June: The 2210 from Manchester will stop at Greenbank at 2303 but will then run non stop to Chester. A connecting replacement bus will leave Altrincham at 2250 and call at all stations (Greenbank 2354, Cuddington 0002). The 2313 from Manchester (normally due Cuddington 0020) will be a bus Calling at Cuddington at 0108.

Sundays 23 June to 28 July inclusive: All trains will be replaced by buses calling outside Norley Road shops. To Chester, they will depart at 1208 and every 2 hours until 2208. To Stockport (for trains to Manchester) they will depart at 0855 and every 2 hours until 2055.
