MINIATURE RAILWAY SOCIETY CHARITY EVENT

A Charity Gala will be held at Sandiway Miniature Railway, home of the Mid Cheshire Society of Model Engineers (MCSME) over the weekend of 28/29 June. All proceeds from the event will be given to The Christie Charity which provides enhanced services over and above what the NHS funds at the world class Christie Hospital

During the weekend of the Gala, the railway will host visiting locomotives.

Sandiway Miniature Railway is accessed via Blakemere Village and not only will you be able to ride on one of several live steam locomotives but if you are over 16 years of age you may also have the opportunity to drive a miniature locomotive for yourself.

The dates and times you need are as follows:

Saturday 28 June: official opening and parade of engines at 11:30am; public running from 12:00 noon to 4:00pm; drive a locomotive at various times during the day.

Sunday 29 June: public running from 12:00 noon to 4:00pm; drive a locomotive at various times during the day.

Please remember that all children should be accompanied by an adult while on the site and when riding one of our trains.

BUILDING DEVELOPMENT

Before the May PC meeting representatives of Redrow and David Wilson addressed the council about a proposed housing development in the village.

The development would consist of 310 units to be built on land to the south of the A556, Chester Road, which has previously been thought to be beyond the reach of village development. However CWAC has a shortfall in its quota of housebuilding and is looking for new sites on which to build so although the village has fulfilled its own quota this land could still be developed. It is classified as Open Countryside which comes between Brownfield and Green Belt. Although we have a Neighbourhood Plan in place which should protect the village, the need to meet the 5 year housing demand overrides it.

There would be 3 separate parcels of land, each needing its own planning application but it would be treated as one coordinated scheme. It would stretch along the land between Kennel Lane and Pool Lane. The developers expect to have planning permission before the end of the year and could be on site by January. The whole project would probably take 4 years to complete.

The PC will have a public meeting once the planning application goes on the CWAC portal.

WEAVERHAM ROAD CAR PARK TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT

Traffic flow plates, also known as "alligator teeth" will be installed at the village car park which is adjacent to Sandiway school on Weaverham Road.

This is a safety measure, making traffic travel in one direction as indicated on the car park signage and helping to discourage unsociable behaviour.

Work is scheduled to take place during school summer holidays in August.
