### **IDEAL TIME TO GIVE THE VILLAGE A WAR MEMORIAL**

There is a large quantity of stone which was part of the original Round Tower but was too badly damaged to be used in the rebuild. This is being stored for the village by CWAC but they are anxious to be rid of it and if we want to keep this stone we have to quickly find our own secure storage for it.

It has been suggested that we could use this stone to build a war memorial for the village. For many years it has been widely acknowledged by residents that our village should have a War Memorial. The lack of such a memorial is probably due mainly to the fact that parish councils are not able, by law, to take on the project of creating one. They may, however, maintain an existing one.

However it could be possible to create one if a group of residents could be found to undertake the project. Now would seem to be the ideal time as it could be designed to use some of this old stone which was once part of a landmark that would have been familiar to those whose names would appear on the monument and which was cherished by many residents.

### MERE LANE PARKING UPDATE

From the CWAC Highways & Parish Council Joint Working Party

Following consultation, work will begin on the car park extension on Mere Lane during March. In addition to the 16 extra parking spaces, a new, extra disabled parking space will be created outside the Mere Lane shops.

There will be a temporary footpath for the duration of the project for residents walking from Sandown Crescent through to Mere Lane. We would ask for your understanding and patience during the construction period.

The cherry tree, which needs to be moved, has been inspected by the Tree Preservation Officer and is thought to be in poor condition. It will be replaced by planting a reasonable sized cherry tree alongside the car park extension.

### Full details of the proposed works will be on view in the library.

- Neighbourhood Plan The consultation phase is now over and the draft plan is being written up into the required official terminology. It will then be put to the full parish council for consideration.
- The council was informed by Borough councillor, Harry Tonge, that council tax is likely to rise by 1.99% with 2% for the social care precept making a total rise of 3.99%.
- Plans for the addition of extra classrooms at Cuddington Primary School have been approved.
- The Jubilee Play Area has had its annual inspection and no issues of concern were found. Councillors were concerned about the amount of mud on Smithy Lane caused by farm vehicles working in fields beside the lane. Mud had even spread onto the A49 which could lead to dangerous driving conditions.
- Work has been completed on part of the footpath from the A49 at Granny's Hump to the Whitegate Way at Ravensclough. One section has been all but impassable for some time because of wet mud. Councillors and walkers are delighted with the results.
- The long awaited allotments which are being provided by Taylor Wimpey at the village end of the Eden Grange site could be ready for use by May or June of this year. All those on the waiting list have been contacted to see if they are still interested and 2 meetings have been held with Taylor Wimpey to discuss how the allotment site will be managed.
- The Traffic and Transport Group feels that the 82 hourly bus service seems to have settled into reliable operation now. Rather than seeking to increase its frequency they are going to concentrate on negotiating for a greater cover of the village. While there are 3 bus stops on Ash Road there is nothing at all in the rest of the village. They will try to negotiate some coverage in Cuddington and Delamere Park
- The Facilities and Community Group are trying to get all voluntary groups together in an attempt to develop a 'Good Neighbour' scheme, the need for which was indicated by the Village Plan survey.

#### **HOMEWATCH**

There will be full weekend road closures on the A556 between Tabley and Bowden on the first 2 weekends in March and possibly the third as well. This is while the new road is connected to the existing one.
