- Our PCSO reported a quiet time recently with traffic being the main focus of attention. A car was stolen from outside a house on Hadrian Way after the keys were taken from the house. This should be a reminder to us all that constant vigilance is needed to keep our property and possessions safe.
- CWAC has acquired a state of the art machine called a Pothole Pro which is supposed to deal with our potholes more effectively than other manual methods and in a fraction of the time. It is being trialed around the borough and some residents will have been lucky enough to have witnessed this amazing machine in operation in the village. Other, more traditional methods are still being used as well to deal with the ever increasing numbers of potholes in our roads.
- A donation from our Borough Councillors from the Neighbourhood Pride Allowance has enabled work to be done on tidying up areas of the village. This includes cutting back overgrown foliage in alleyways, cleaning of road signs and cleaning areas in Boundary Lane Green play area which had become slippery underfoot and hazardous.
- The Council has donated £200 to St John's towards building improvements
- The village has two new grit bins. One is on the village car park on Weaverham Road and the other on Primrose Hill.

The Regional Representative of the Leprosy Mission is due to give a presentation on how people's stamps are being sold and their proceeds used to fund the Mission's work on Sunday 7th May at 10.45am at Sandiway Methodist Church, Weaverham Road. All are welcome.

However Leprosy Mission has now made the tough decision to stop accepting donations of stamps. Over the past 2 years, the value of used stamps has greatly reduced, and with the introduction of bar-coded stamps, their value has been further decreased! The Leprosy Mission wishes to express a huge thank you to everyone who has collected stamps to raise funds for people affected by leprosy.
