The next meeting of the parish council will take place at the village hall on Monday October 21st at 7.15pm. A Public Forum will take place during the meeting when residents can put questions to the council. This will be very soon into the meeting and residents should arrive for 7.15pm.

### Before the Meeting our PCSO Nichola Devey gave a report to the council

- \* There have been complaints about speeding on Norley Road and Weaverham Road and speed checks have been carried out with several people being caught and reported. Police do not handle prosecutions themselves but send the details to a central body to be processed. She does speed checks in the village at least once a week when possible.
- \* Antisocial Behaviour increased over the summer which is a regular annual pattern. When this has occurred on the playing field the PFA have been able to provide CCTV footage to enable the culprits to be identified. Nichola can then work with Weaverham High School to contact parents of regular offenders in the hope of getting signed contracts from them concerning their children's behaviour. Mainly these children are in the 12-14 age group. She will also work in the school with such things as peer group sessions.
- \* There has been a white van with no identification touring the area looking for signs that properties are occupied by elderly people. One resident was charged £600 for hedge cutting.
- \* Nichola is working in both our primary schools on topics such as Stranger Danger and issuing notes to parents who park in dangerous places.
- \* She was asked about nitrous oxide canisters which can be extremely dangerous if inhaled. She said that she had found many but it was very difficult to do anything about this new craze as they are legal with no restrictions on who can buy them as they have many legitimate uses.
- There have been cases over the holiday period when notification of planning or licensing applications have not been issued in time for representations by the public to be received by the closing date. In view of this it was agreed that a request will be made for these to be put on the website where they will be much easier to find.
- A group of 3 councillors will be set up to review the recommendations of the Village Plan to see whether any further work can be done towards implementing these where possible.
- A Community Safety Action Group has been set up to work collectively to reduce 'both perceived and actual crime and antisocial behaviour levels' in the village. It will include the chairman of the parish council, Cuddington and Weaverham ward councillors, our PCSO, representation from Weaverham High School, our Playing Field Association, CWAC Communities and Youth Services and Weaver Vale Housing Trust.
- There has been a problem for some time with bins around the village becoming full and overflowing onto the pavement. Complaints have been received from residents. At first it was thought that the bins were not being emptied as per the council schedule. However it has now become apparent that residents are using the street bins for disposing of their own household waste. Although the bins will be emptied on request if they are full, they immediately get filled again so the problem does not go away. This behaviour degrades our environment and the council will prosecute if anyone is caught.
- An application has been received from Cemex to extend their Forest Hill quarry to the north towards Weaverham Road. This could potentially lead to heavy vehicles accessing the site via the A556, along Norley Road and down Weaverham Road past Sandiway School. Councillors want to ensure this does not happen and that the only access to the site is via the A49 and Millington Lane, with notices to this
