LOCAL ISSUES NEED LOCAL PEOPLE TO SPEAK UP FOR THEM

YOU could help keep Cuddington a vibrant, good place to live by becoming a Parish Councillor

YOU could be in at the 'grass roots' level of Local Government and be involved in making things happen or getting things sorted!

YOU could get local views about local issues brought to the attention of the powers that be.

You only need to be able to give up one evening a month to attend Parish Council meetings, helping out with projects where you are able, and in return you will receive the satisfaction of knowing that you are helping your local community.

Candidates must be at least 18 years of age and a British subject or a citizen of the Commonwealth and must satisfy **at least one** of the following:

- have, during the whole of the previous 12 months, occupied land, or other property in the community, either as owner or tenant
- have, during the whole of the previous 12 months, had your principal or only place of work in the community.
- have resided in the community during the whole of the previous 12 months

The Parish Council normally meets on the third Monday of the month at 7.00pm (except August).

SAVE OUR SANDIWAY SURGERY

Patients of Sandiway Surgery should now have received a letter from Danebridge confirming the closure of the surgery on 31st December 2021. We suggest you keep this letter as it provides information on the remaining services that Danebridge is prepared to offer its patients.

This is a very sad outcome for the community and the SOS team would like to thank everyone who has very actively supported the campaign to save the surgery over the past 20 months.

Cuddington Parish Council has supported the campaign throughout ensuring that important communications were delivered to residents via the Round Tower, the village website, noticeboards and direct communications to residents at home.

The Parish Council wrote to Louise Gittins, the Chair and Leader of Cheshire West and Chester Borough Council, to express its concerns, about the decision in July by the NHS Cheshire Commissioning Group to close the surgery. The Parish Council has asked for a meeting to discuss the impact on patients in the Parish and on the wider community.

Louise Gittins has responded offering to arrange a meeting with Parish Councillors, and the NHS integrated Care Partnership to discuss the "future model of primary care" promised by Danebridge to its patients in Sandiway and Cuddington.

If you or your family have any problems getting appointments, access to care or medication through Danebridge then make sure you formally report it to Danebridge Practice and copy in Christopher Leese Associate Director of Primary care at: CCG.corporate@nhs.net

There is a national petition to persuade the government to exert pressure on GP practices to open their doors for face-to-face appointments just as dentists, opticians and other specialists are doing.
