ON DEMAND RURAL BUS SERVICE


Cheshire West and Chester Council's new on-demand rural bus service has proved a big success. In its first few weeks of operation the service has clocked up an impressive 347 journeys with 569 passengers. Passengers select their pick-up and drop off stops when they book and app users receive a confirmation email. Payment can be made by card or cash on the bus. The service operates between 7am and 7pm, Monday to Friday, with low-floor access. This demand-responsive solution helps people of all ages to attend medical appointments, access further education and training or go shopping. The service has an introductory single £2 flat fare, rising to £2.50 in November. The 'itravel' bus service can be booked online, using a mobile phone app, or by phone on 0330 678 1545. People aged 19 and under can travel half fare and children under 5 years travel free.

Two residents attended the September meeting to request that something is done about the dangerous bend on Weaverham Road opposite Smithy Lane. A recent accident there is just the most recent of many. They would like to see signage to warn people of the bend and an extension of the speed limit. This road is busy at school drop off and pick up times and is also used by people going to the cemetery who have no pavement to protect them. They were informed that the Council has tried to get signs put up but have been refused by CWAC. They will try again and our Borough councillors will support them.

Cllr Gillian Edwards reported on the success of a scheme to provide packed lunches for children during the school holidays. Up to 40 meals were provided daily at the library.

Police have carried out a speed check on the 20mph section of Norley Road recorded a number of drivers exceeding the limit. They will be sent warning letters.

The Council are contributing financial help for a defibrillator for the Eden Grange estate.

Lighting is to be put on the path in the playing field which links Norley Road with Greenfield Way which will also help to make access to the Youth Club safer.

Concern was raised about the state of the footpath on the A49 to Weaverham which is officially identified as a safe walking route to Weaverham High School for village children. Grass verges have not been tended and as a result have encroached on the footpath making it narrower. This has been reported to the relevant authorities.

By the end of the month we should have Speed Indicator Devices installed around the village to discourage people from speeding. There will be poles erected in a number of places so that the devices can be moved around enabling speeding hotspots to be identified. The first sites will be on Weaverham Road and Chester Road.
