PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Parish Council have started to make preliminary enquiries in relation to the provision of a GP surgery and Wellness Hub. They have set up a working party who will update the Council at its monthly meetings. The updates will be reported via the Round Tower Newsletter.

The July meeting of the Parish Council was presented with a Draft Monitoring Report on the Cuddington Neighbourhood Plan.

In June 2015, Cuddington Parish Council was successful with its application to become a Neighbourhood Area, and in October 2015 the Neighbourhood Plan project was launched at a public meeting. The most significantly developed part of the Parish, largely bounded by the A49, A556 and Norley Road was nominated by Cheshire West and Chester (CWaC) as one of 10 Key Service Centres (KSC) in the Borough. This is based on its sustainability in providing social and welfare services to a larger rural area.

The Cuddington Neighbourhood Plan reflects the comments, observations and concerns raised by the residents of the Parish about its future, gathered in consultation processes over two and a half years. Evidence had also been gathered during the development of a Village Plan from 2013 to 2015. That report, published in July 2015, provided a very solid base for the Neighbourhood Plan.

The Neighbourhood Plan was Made in February 2019 and is a statutory planning document regarding the use and development of land and premises in the Parish. This can be found, along with all the research and survey documents, on the Village Website

The purpose of the Monitoring Report is to ensure that the aims of the Neighbourhood Plan (NP) are being delivered by the Parish Council; that the NP policies are being referred to and taken note of by the CWaC planning officers; and to reflect on changes in the local area and planning policy which may be relevant to the NP.

In addition, the Monitoring Report has examined the receipt and application of Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) payments from developers. CIL allows local authorities in England and Wales to raise funds from developers who are undertaking new building projects in their area. Money gained through CIL is used to pay for strategic infrastructure projects. A significant benefit of having a Neighbourhood Plan is the entitlement to receive 25% of CIL monies for use in the Parish.

The draft Monitoring Report will be considered by the Parish Council at a special Council meeting after the summer recess.

itravel – ON DEMAND BUS SERVICE

Cheshire West and Chester Council's on-demand rural bus service, which aims to improve connectivity in some of the more remote parts of the borough, recently celebrated its first year of service. It covers a wide area including Cuddington & Sandiway, Helsby, Frodsham, Delamere and Acton Bridge, as well as some other villages, where no commercial services are available. The bus service can be booked online, by mobile phone app, or phone call to 0330 678 1545, and allows a resident, or group of residents, to request a bus for a specific journey. The itravel service has an 'introductory' single £2 flat fare - people aged 19 and under can travel half price and children under five years travel for free. Concessionary pass holders travel free after 09:30 Monday to Friday and anytime Saturday and Sunday.
